**DEACON DONALD PRENDERGAST**

My dear St. Joseph Family,

While some of you know how my life as a Deacon has turned a corner, many of you do not. I am sure that there have been some who have noticed that I have not been at Mass. Well, it's because in my constant and prayerful search for God's voice in my life I have come to know that I am being called to serve in a new way. In early Fall I spent a week on retreat with Deacon Alex Gapay at a Monastery that I have visited with my family for the past 10 years. Deacon Alex and I had a wonderful time. Soon after returning home I received an email from the Sister in charge, the Prioris, Sister Amena who asked me if I knew of a Deacon who might be interested in being the Monastery Caretaker. After speaking to my wife, Marilyn, about this calling, I told Sister Amena that in fact I was interested. We began to meet and discuss the job as well as serving as Deacon of the Monastery. I consulted my Spiritual Director and our pastor, Father Dennis. I even discussed this opportunity with Bishop Dominick Lagonegro. On January 7<sup>th</sup> I began a trial period working and living at the Monastery of Bethlehem located in Livingston Manor, Sullivan County.

There are 19 Sisters here in total and while they pray and create beautiful religious icons and pottery, I take care of the grounds, buildings, and security. The charism of this religious order is silence and solitude. While they speak, they don't have unnecessary conversations.

The day begins with Morning Prayer at 6:45am followed by Mass and ends with Evening Prayer at 5:45pm. Their patron is St. Bruno. Many of their traditions are from the Eastern Rite but they are Roman Catholics. As for my official assignment the Archdiocese will decide if I am to be assigned to the Monastery or the local parish. Until then my name will continue to appear on the bulletin as Fr. Dennis will continue to be my Pastor until the official transfer. I remain here alone driving back and forth to see my family until the end of the school year. During the summer my family will join me here.

Please know that you are all in my heart and my prayers. Please pray for me in this new vocation of service. You are always welcome to visit and spend time on retreat, even if just for the day. The Sisters can be reached at 845-439-4300. You are always welcome. I would like to thank my brother Deacons whom I will miss most of all. Each of you have made me a better Deacon and servant of God's people. God bless you all.

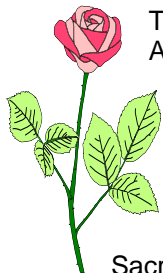
