THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: I Kings 17:10-16

Elijah asked a widow for a cup of water and a piece of bread. She told him she was almost out of flour, and that she and her son would soon starve. Elijah told her not to be afraid, as God had told him the jar of flour would not go empty. So she did as he had asked and prepared bread from the last of her flour. As God had said, her jar did not go empty, and she and her son had plenty to eat.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The high priests entered the sanctuary each year and offered a sacrifice, but not a sacrifice of their own blood. Just as people die once and are judged, Christ was offered up once for the sins of many.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus expressed disgust over the hypocrisy of some of the scribes for wanting special treatment from the people. He watched the wealthy put large contributions into the collection box, but explained that what they gave was surplus wealth, and not a real sacrifice. He told them the biggest donation was a small amount from a widow, because she had given up the only money that she had to live on.

ATTENTION: GIFT BEARERS AT MASS

If you would like to bring up the offertory gifts of bread and wine at Sunday Mass we ask you to please see the ushers before Mass begins. It is also a good idea to sit near to the gift table.

Starting November 21st and 22nd we will change the way the offertory gifts are brought to the Altar. It is important for the ushers to be aware that you are willing to bring up the offertory gifts.

Many times the ushers are searching for people to carry the offertory gifts. Other times the people who wish to carry the gifts sit far away from the gift table and it takes time for the ushers to locate them and begin the offertory gift procession.

The family that has offered a Mass intention for that Mass has priority in being gift bearers at that Mass, however, they should still notify the ushers and be seated somewhere near to the gift table.
