

## THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Daniel 12:1-3

Daniel discusses the end of the world, a time when the dead shall rise and everyone will be judged. He warns that some shall "be an everlasting horror and disgrace." But he promises that some will live forever, and the wise will shine brightly to lead others to justice.

### Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14, 18

Priests repeatedly offered sacrifices that were unable to take away sin. But through Jesus' one sacrifice, our sins were forgiven, leaving no need for other offerings.

### Gospel: Mark 13:24-32

Jesus told his disciples that many signs would be seen before the end of the world. He explained that the earth would pass away but his words would not. He also told them that neither the angels nor himself, but only his Father knew when this would take place.

## ASK THE PASTOR

**“What is the black square cap some priests wear and why do some priests wear it and other do not?”**

The square-shaped hat worn by some priests is called the Biretta, in Latin *Birretum*. It is the formal and proper head covering for all clerics when vested in liturgical vestments or cassock.

The biretta remains a requirement in the celebration of the Extraordinary form of the Roman Rite (the Latin Mass). It is optional in the Ordinary Form of Mass.

The *biretta* is quite often seen worn by bishops and cardinals when they are dressed in cassock. Some people think the *biretta* was abolished for priests, deacons and seminarians but the biretta has never been abolished.

It may be used in the celebration of Holy Mass, the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours, the celebration of the Sacraments as proper, and as part of Choir Dress. It is connected with liturgical celebrations and with the use of the Cassock.

The Roman Biretta is a square—shaped hat with three "horns", or peaks, and a tuft of silk threads that sometime make a pompon or tassel on the top.

If a cleric wears the biretta, there are certain customs on when it is worn and when it is removed. All clergy can wear the biretta when seated. Only the those in Mass vestments wear the biretta while walking through church, others, by tradition, in cassock and surplice carry it. The biretta is removed at the name of "Jesus" and when all 3 persons of the Blessed Trinity are mentioned
